Michelle Smith: When there's an emergency, the lab will be there, pharmacy will be there, nurses from other units will come.

Michelle Smith: We all work as a team.

Michelle Smith: The patients love us, like they know us.

Michelle Smith: They know us by our names, they say hi to us in the grocery store.

Michelle Smith: We are a really close-knit community.

Michelle Smith: You know, everybody knows everybody.

[Cut to: Physicians and nurses working at the reception desk and using computers.]

[Cut to: Kathy Thompson speaking on camera outside the hospital.]

Kathy Thompson: I love it.

Kathy Thompson: I love helping people.

Kathy Thompson: It's a great place to be because it's very small.

Kathy Thompson: You get the one-on-one attention, you get the care that you need, and it's pointed directly to you.

Kathy Thompson: It's not five different people at the same time.

[Cut to: Bright, clean hospital corridors, patient rooms, and healthcare staff moving throughout the facility.]

Patient: I recently spent three days in Stony Brook Eastern Long Island Hospital.

Patient: I was so pleased with their kindness and care.

Patient: As soon as I was given my room, they immediately responded to make me comfortable and give me anything I needed.

Patient: Congrats on your staff.

Patient: I would have felt more secure being in a big hospital, but from the moment I met my surgeon before I went into the surgery, Dr. Swaszek spoke to my husband and I in such a clear and knowledgeable way, listening, answering all my questions.

[Cut to: A hero shot of Dr. Luke Swaszek. Dr. Swaszek speaks with a colleague.]

Patient: Ted and I, my husband and I, just felt really reassured and safe.

[Cut back to: The female patient speaking in her hospital room.]

Patient: All of those preconceptions are out the window.

Patient: I could not have gotten better care anywhere.

Patient: As a matter of fact, I think the care I got here was better than in any other hospital.

[Cut to: Close-up of an anesthesiologist.]

Patient: And the anesthesiologist came and seen me twice after surgery.

Patient: That doesn't happen any other place.

Patient: So this place is kind of magic.

[Cut to: Dr. Luke Swaszek speaking on camera from his office.]

[Intercut with: A hero shot of Dr. Swaszek standing back-to-back with an anesthesiologist, both with their arms folded.]

Luke Swaszek, MD: We have all the resources of a large academic medical center, but we deliver care with the personal attention of a community hospital.

Luke Swaszek, MD: Our patients are not just numbers. They're our neighbors, our friends, and our family members.

[Cut to: Abida Butler, MD speaking on camera from her office.]

[Cut to: Hospital interiors. Physicians and nurses stand around tables, taking turns writing and signing thank-you letters to patients.]

[Cut to: Roy Romard speaking on camera in a hospital corridor.]

[Cut to: Ashton L. Stanton, MD speaking on camera in a medical office. Medical equipment is visible in the background.]
